#### IRR CLM887 - IDENTIFY WHEN ACCIDENTS OCCUR AT WORKER'S HOME

### **Background:**

This IRR was submitted by Indiana to identify when an accident has occurred at the employee's home because the employee is considered a "work from home" employee. The request is to add a new code to DN0249 Accident Premises Code to identify when an accident has occurred at an employee's residence. After discussion at the Forum in San Diego on 4/1/2019, the following changes were identified (in red below).

# **Proposed Resolution:**

#### **ACCIDENT PREMISES CODE – DN0249**

Definition: A code to indicate the premises where the accident occurred.

Orig/Rev: 07/01/97, 04/24/03, 03/31/07, 04/04/14

Record: R21

Format: 1 A/N

Values: **E = Employer** 

Accident occurred on employer's/lessor's premises.

L = Lessee

Accident occurred on the premises of the lessee for which the employee was hired to work.

X = Other

Accident occurred at a location other than the employer's or lessee's premises not otherwise specified.

## ? = Employee Residence

Accident occurred at the employee's residence.

DP Rule: When Accident Premises Code (DN0245) is equal to? Employee Residence; Accident Site Street (DN0122), Accident Site City (DN0121), Accident Site State Code (DN0123), Accident Site Postal Code (DN0033), and Accident Site Country Code (DN0280) shall not be edited against the Employee Mailing Primary Address (DN0046), Employee Mailing City (DN0048), Employee Mailing State Code (DN0049), Employee Mailing Postal Code (DN0050), and Employee Mailing Country Code (DN0155).
